My vision for ICNA is to make it the *most dynamic and powerful organization that promotes global access to excellent care for children with neurological problems worldwide.* I would like to consolidate the excellent work done by my distinguished predecessors and take it a step further, through these strategies-

- 1. **Enhance visibility of ICNA** -use every opportunity to raise awareness about ICNA's goals and activities.
- 2. Increase membership of ICNA -exponentially, globally
- 3. **Disseminate Education to all professionals and caregivers** Use innovative technology and teaching methods.
- 4. Raise the international profile of JICNA –take steps to build its impact factor
- 5. Vibrant EB- ensure involvement of All EB members in ICNA projects and activities –each one do one!
- 6. **Expand horizons, transcend boundaries!** tailor ICNA activities to the felt needs of various regions. Build Local Capacity: *create exchange programs* for training and skill development.
- 7. Foster collaborative research -global and regional, link senior mentors to young mentees.
- 8. Money matters! -increase congress revenues, sponsorships, create an ICNA fund-raising committee.
- Build Connections interactive collegial and organizational links; affiliate regional and
 national societies with ICNA; develop links with national/regional authorities to implement
 policies
- 10. Engage younger members -amalgamate fresh ideas with wisdom of senior members, incentivise with junior research awards and scholarships. Link FLICNA members with each ICNA committee; ensure continuity and smooth transition of ICNA responsibilities to the next generation.

I believe my experience as EB member and Secretary has provided me deeper insights into the functioning of ICNA and *I am now even better equipped to lead ICNA to scale greater heights.*
